## Florida Growers Needed to Recruit Junior Citrus Ambassadors

*Captain Citrus School Visits Teach Students about Florida Citrus*

**Bartow, Fla. (Jan. 21, 2013)** – Due to the proliferation of beverage choices, orange juice may not be a staple in children’s homes today. The Florida Department of Citrus (FDOC) is expanding “The Adventures of Captain Citrus” educational initiative statewide to create a personal, emotional engagement between Florida students and citrus. The cornerstone of this program is the OJ4NRG Tour, an elementary school visit from a Florida grower and our orange super hero, Captain Citrus, followed by sampling fresh citrus and Florida orange juice.

From February through April, Captain Citrus will be visiting 150 schools throughout the state to convert second grade students into junior Florida citrus ambassadors. Growers and their family members are needed to participate in school visits within their own county. The time commitment is minimal (approximately one hour per school) and FDOC will coordinate all details and provide key talking points for growers.

In addition, FDOC is looking for fresh citrus donations in each county so that students can taste locally grown oranges, tangerines and grapefruit.
